Primary Responsibilities – Youth Learn to Sail

- Teach and supervise youth sailing classes for beginner and intermediate levels following TACS curriculum and safety standards
- Foster a safe, fun, and encouraging learning environment
- Introduce and reinforce essential sailing concepts: terminology, boat handling, points of sail, sail trim, tacking/jibing, capsize recovery, and basic navigation
- Support group instruction and assist with private lessons as assigned
- Maintain fleet and facility readiness—including rigging, derigging, boat care, and equipment checks
- Help lead daily and weekly recognition activities and end-of-season celebrations
- Model seamanship, sportsmanship, and positive communication
- Uphold all safety protocols and respond appropriately in emergencies
- Perform additional duties as assigned by the Sailing Director

Qualifications & Competencies

- Strong leadership, communication, and interpersonal skills, especially with youth
- Organized, adaptable, and able to work effectively outdoors in a fast-paced environment
- Commitment to safety and risk management
- Friendly, approachable, and collaborative with staff, parents, and students
- Physically able to lift up to 50 lbs., swim confidently, and work long hours outside

Working Conditions

- Outdoor waterfront environment with varied weather (50°F–90°F)
- Requires standing, walking, lifting, and extended time on the water
- Full-time seasonal schedule (approx. 40 hours/week)
